TSGA CEO, Sue Grau, said it was a positive first step in bringing together the shared vision of the industry, government, and community for an enduring and prosperous salmon industry, and one that continues to deliver millions of dollars to regional communities across the state.

The Government's Plan backs in the world-leading innovation already driving our sustainable farming practices.

"We are Tasmania's biggest primary industry, with a low carbon footprint and low environmental impact, locking in Australia's food security by growing sustainable protein under some of the strictest regulations in the world," Ms Grau said.

"The recently released Tasmanian Agri-Food ScoreCard confirmed that salmon remains the highest value food product farmed in the state."
